TOPIC INTRODUCTION

Data assessment is at the core of an SMP, though it can be an overwhelming task. One of the key steps to [get started](#) is to understand current knowledge and data. Using existing studies and data can save time and money, as compared to collecting new data, and help identify the needs, data gaps, and goals that an SMP can address. In order to drive productive and focused conversations around data relevancy, it is critical to clearly articulate the [purpose and scope](#) of a SMP. These [Pre-planning Questions](#) are a great place to start.

Today's call will center around the methods and sources of collecting data, and approaches for distilling data into a workable format, determining how much data is needed and what is relevant to the SMP effort.
